SQL

- choosing GROUP BY fields
 - if the goal is to group rows relating to unique things, use the primary key
 - if you are grouping by the primary key, including other attributes of that thing is unnecessary – it muddles the intent and potentially reduces efficiency
- avoid unnecessary J0INs
 - only J0IN if you need columns from that table that you don't already have
 - e.g. SAILOR NATURAL JOIN RESERVATION already includes Bid, so you don't need BOAT to count how many different boats each sailor has reserved
